





Upon its chartering February 28, 1867, the Illinois Industrial University became a model of the Land Grant University, transforming the "treeless prairie" into a world-renowned agricultural and engineering school. Built between 1907 and 1913, the three Round Barns anchored the 20-acre dairy demonstration farm and were added to the National Historic Register in 1994.



The UIHistories project, which was Kalev Leetaru's senior undergraduate thesis, is the first comprehensive historical survey of the University's founding campus, covering the foundations of the University, offering insights into early student life, and providing historical biographies of all of the buildings, class gifts, memorials, and collections of campus. In March 2007, more than 30,000 pages of digitized historical material was added, including campus maps, building dedication proceedings, course catalogs, pictorial guides, and more, from the founding of the University through present day.
