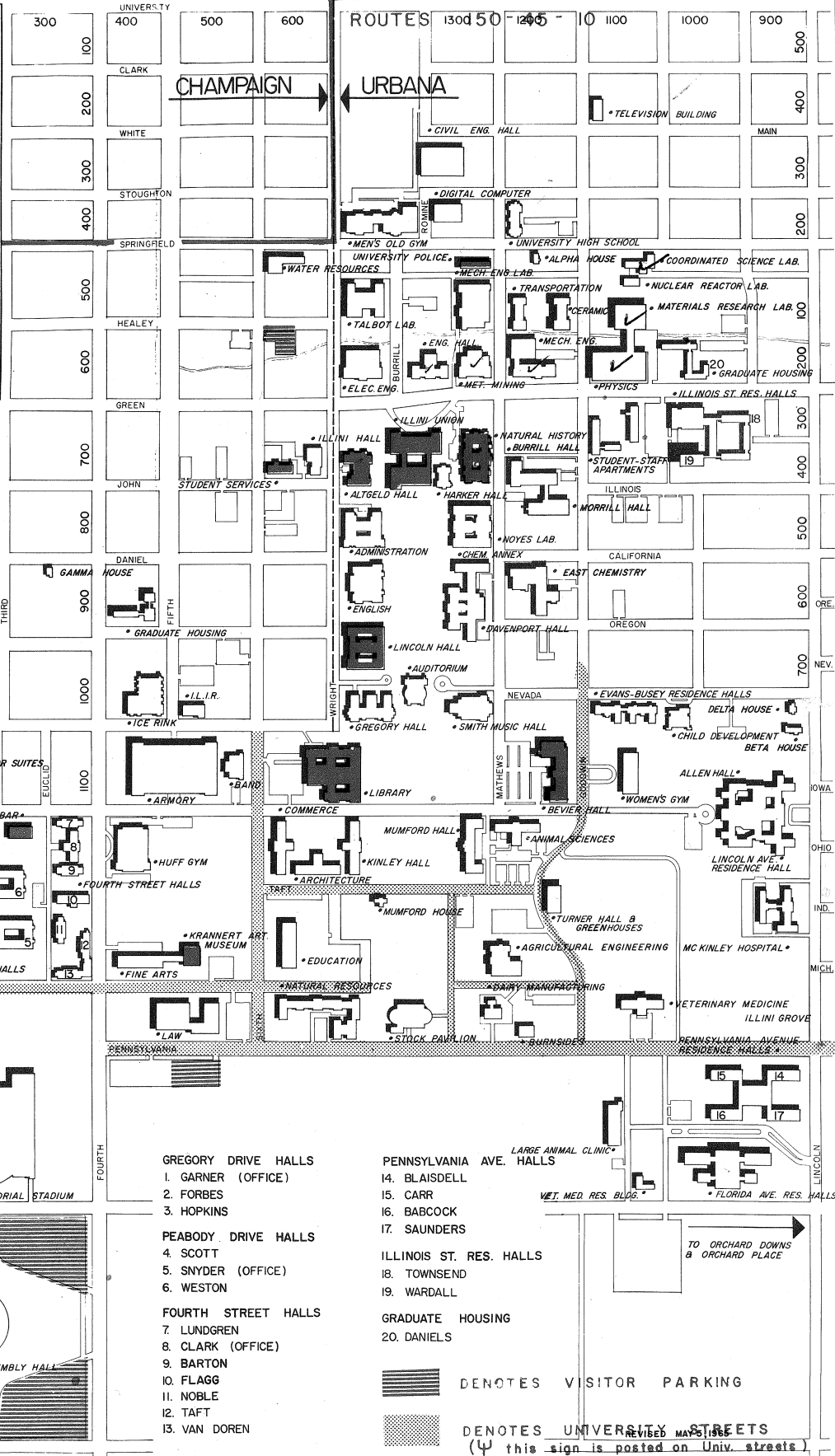
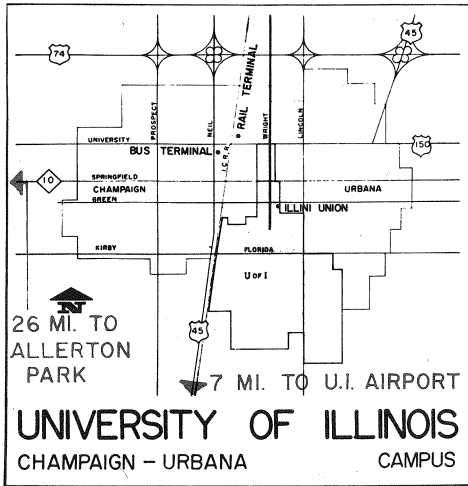

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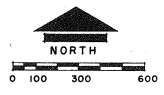

## WELCOME TO THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS

This is your state university. Whatever the length of your stay, whether you are here as student, faculty member, alumni, or visitor, you are a welcome member of the University community. We hope that your stay will be pleasant and rewarding and that you will return frequently.

### Information Sources

University Information Office - North lobby, Illini Union. This is the best single source of general campus information. A central file is kept here to help you find the offices and addresses of all students and faculty. Also available are hours which museums and exhibits are open to visit, campus calendar of entertainment, and listings of motels and hotels in Champaign-Urbana.

Information Counter - lobby, Student Services Building. Offices in this building include Dean of Men, Dean of Women, Dean of Students, Student Counseling, Student Employment and Housing.

Arrangements for group or individual tours of the campus, either by bus, automobile or foot, may be made by writing or telephoning Campus Tour Office, Room 115, Illini Union (333-3668), Urbana, Illinois. Guides are available to show visitors around the campus at 10:00 A. M. and 1:00 P. M. Monday through Friday and at 10:00 A. M. (only) on Saturdays. Such arrangements should be made as far in advance as possible, to be sure guides are available.

### Points of Interest on Campus

Illini Union - the "front door" to the campus also serves as a community center for students, faculty, alumni and visitors. It was built and furnished without cost to the State Treasury, and includes lounges, food services, meeting rooms, bowling lanes, guest rooms, and other services. A new addition to the original building was completed in 1963. The building's Georgian architecture was adapted from Colonial Williamsburg. The clock in the cupola is a gift of the class of 1878.

Alma Mater - This statuary group, a familiar landmark, "welcoming the youth of the world", is the work of Lorado Taft, an early graduate of the University. It is located in front of Altgeld Hall on the southeast corner of Green and Wright Streets.

Altgeld Hall - Originally this building was the University Library; now it is occupied by the Mathematics Department. In the tower are chimes given by alumni, which sound every quarter hour.

Krannert Art Museum - provides galleries for displaying the University's permanent collection of art works and for presentation of other exhibitions. The building was financed by gifts from alumni and friends. Open Monday through Saturday: 9 a. m. to 12 Noon and 1-5 p. m.; Sunday: 2-5 p. m.

Library - The University Library contains more books and materials than that of any other state university library, with collections currently totaling more than 4,500,000 items. In size it ranks third among all American universities and fifth among all American libraries. Exhibits of interest are displayed in first floor corridors.

Assembly Hall - This building completed in 1963 is a multi-purpose building used for convocations, concerts, dramatics, concerts, athletics, exhibits, and similar events. The Hall has a total seating capacity of 18,000. It has the world's largest edge-supported dome, 400 feet in diameter rising 128 feet above the activity floor. No tax funds were used in construction of the \$8,350,000 building, which is to be paid for by building income and student fees. Open Monday - Saturday: 9 a. m. - 5 p. m. and Sunday 2-4 p. m.

### Off-Campus Points of Interest

University of Illinois-Willard Airport - opened in 1945; it is located 6 miles south of Champaign on U.S. Route 45. It is one of the largest and finest educationally-owned airports in America, covering 771 acres. The area also is served by a commercial airline operating from Willard Airport.

Allerton Park - A beautiful country estate, given to the University in 1946 by Robert Allerton, is located 26 miles southwest of Champaign and can be reached by marked roads from either Illinois Route 105 or 47. Gardens with statuary from all over the world and woodland trails are open to the public. The estate is used by the University as a conference center.
