UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS 27th EVACUATION HOSPITAL

(Not a Reserve Unit)

The University of Illinois through its College of Medicine has been authorized to organize the 27 Evacuation Hospital, an affiliated unit of the U. Army. This is a 750-bed mobile hospital designe for duty in the combat zone. The personnel of the unit includes 47 officers, 318 enlisted men, and the unit includes 47 officers of the hospital all have a official connection with the University and it desired that the nurses and enlisted men be recruited so far as possible from University personnel, but faculty and student.

Enlisted men for the jobs of bugler, butche carpenter, chauffeur, clerk, cook, cook's helpe electrician, mechanic, motorcyclist, plumber, stenographer, medical technician, sanitary technician surgical technician, typist, and basic medical corpsoldier can be enlisted in the Enlisted Reserv Corps through their local draft boards. Enlistmen of students for this unit will be accepted at the University. Such enlisted men will be reserved for this unit for a period of six months or until the activation of the unit for training which will probably be much sooner than that.
