### ON THE CAMPUS

are many points of interest. The map has north at lower left because the campus is narrow there and this arrangement allows for clearer showing of the wider south area. Wright Street, running diagonally from left to right almost in the middle, is the dividing line between Urbana on the east (left), and Champaign on the west (right). Key numbering of buildings begins in the upper center left of the map.

- 1 ILLINI GROVE, campus picnic place.
- 2 MCKINLEY HOSPITAL, adequately equipped to care for any emergency, though most of its patients are not seriously ill. A student with a bad cold, for example, is better off in the hospital where he can get care than at his living place where he may infect others. Hospital insurance, which all students carry, pays his bill.
- 3 LINCOLN AVENUE RESIDENCE, housing 548 women.
- 4 PSYCHOLOGY CLINIC, a teaching, research, and service center available for adults and children. Its services in mental testing, personality diagnosis, counseling, and psychotherapy are available to anyone in the state.
- 5 BUSEY HALL, EVANS HALL, residences for 369 women.
- 6 WOMEN'S GYMNASIUM.
- 7 VEGETABLE CROPS BUILDING, used for horticulture research.
- 8 FLORICULTURE BUILDING, for research and teaching in flower growing.
- 9 VETERINARY MEDICINE BUILDING.
- 10 ILLINI VILLAGE, housing 268 families.
- 11 ANIMAL SCIENCES LABORATORY, for study of nutritional processes in domestic animals. Includes air conditioned laboratories where all environmental factors can be controlled, and other special facilities.
- 12 STIVEN HOUSE, named for a long-time director of the School of Music, houses offices, studios, and classrooms.
- 13 THEORY ANNEX, headquarters of music extension work; includes faculty studios.
- 14 MUSIC ANNEX, has classrooms and studios.
- 15 EAST CHEMISTRY BUILDING, devoted to chemical engineering and biochemistry. Central covered area several stories high allows installation of tall equipment.
- 16 SCHOOL OF SOCIAL WORK, headquarters and offices.
- 17 UNIVERSITY CIVIL SERVICE SYSTEM OF ILLINOIS, headquarters of the state-wide system; also in this building, physical plant drafting room.
- 18 INSTITUTE OF GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC AFFAIRS, headquarters and offices.
- 19 UNIVERSITY MEN'S CLUB, center for staff men.
- 20 STUDENT AND STAFF APARTMENTS, 201 living units.

- 21 GRADUATE STUDIO FOR PAINTING, used by advanced art students.
- 22 STENOGRAPHIC BUREAU, providing centralized duplicating and other services.
- 23 BUREAU OF INSTITUTIONAL RESEARCH, a fact-finding agency to study various aspects of the University.
- 24 UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS EMPLOYEES CREDIT UNION.
- 25 CERAMICS BUILDING, museum and corridor exhibits show ceramic products; has kilns and other equipment of interest.
- 26 UNIVERSITY HIGH SCHOOL, offers teaching experience to students in education.
- 27 AERONAUTICAL LABORATORY A, includes a small wind tunnel.
- 28 RAILWAY WHEEL LABORATORY, tests wheels and brakes under conditions varying from emergency stops at speeds over 100 miles per hour to long brake applications such as are made when controlling speed while descending grades.
- 29 MINING AND METALLURGY LABORATORY, contains kiln room, assaying laboratory and other facilities.
- 30 TRANSPORTATION BUILDING, offices and classrooms.
- 31 NUCLEAR RADIATIONS LABORATORY, contains large cyclotron for physics research.
- 32 MECHANICAL ENGINEERING BUILDING, includes shops and laboratories for teaching and research in many fields, including engines, welding, and machine tools.
- 33 ENGINEERING RESEARCH LABORATORY, contains electronic computer able to do in a week mathematics that would take a human lifetime.
- 34 MECHANICAL ENGINEERING LABORATORY, for teaching and research in power and in heating and ventilating. Many different engines are on display. A tremendous refrigerator contains a complete portion of a house for heating and air conditioning research.
- 35 PHYSICS BUILDING, classrooms, teaching and research laboratories. It was in the main lecture room here that in 1922 the first practical sound-on-film movies were shown to the public by the University professor who made them.
- 36 NATURAL HISTORY BUILDING, corridor and museum exhibits of animals, plants, and American Indian and Eskimo culture.
- 37 HARKER HALL, named for a former dean of law, it is the oldest classrooms building on the campus; erected in 1878 for chemistry, later long used by law, now occupied by biological sciences.
- 38 NOYES LABORATORY OF CHEMISTRY, named for a famous head of the chemistry department.
- 39 CHEMISTRY ANNEX, used for beginning classes.
- 40 DAVENPORT HALL, named for a distinguished dean of agriculture.

- 41 AGRONOMY ANNEX AND GREENHOUSE, for study of plant diseases.
- 42 STATE NATURAL HISTORY SURVEY LABORATORY.
- 43 SMITH MUSIC HALL, gift of a trustee in memory of his wife, it bears their name and houses the School of Music. Has studios and a recital hall seating 1,100.
- 44 OBSERVATORY, the laboratory for astronomy.
- 45 MORROW PLOTS, America's oldest soil experiment fields, and world's oldest corn experiment fields, in continuous cultivation since 1876 teaching lessons of soil conservation and nutrition. Markers indicate various soil treatments and returns.
- 46 MUMFORD HALL, named for a great dean of agriculture, is headquarters for the College of Agriculture, Agricultural Experiment Station, and Extension Service in Agriculture and Home Economics.
- 47 ANIMAL GENETICS BUILDING, studies of heredity using fowl and small animals.
- 48 AGRICULTURAL ENGINEERING RESEARCH LABORATORY, for testing farm power equipment, tractors, etc.
- 49 AGRICULTURAL ENGINEERING BUILDING, headquarters for study of farm machinery, buildings, soil and water conservation, and rural electrification.
- 50 AGRONOMY STOREHOUSE.
- 51 DAIRY MANUFACTURES BUILDING, equipment for teaching and research in processing milk products.
- 52 STOCK JUDGING PAVILION, provides livestock show arena, classrooms, and offices.
- 53 MUMFORD HOUSE, named for agriculture dean who long lived here; the oldest structure on the campus; now headquarters of the Small Homes Council, devoted to research and information on better homes for today and the future.
- 54 VETERANS RECREATION BUILDING.
- 55 DAVID KINLEY HALL, named for a great President of the University, an economist instrumental in establishment of the College of Commerce and Business Administration, which occupies this building along with its Bureau of Economic Research and the Bureau of Business Management Service.
- 56 LIBRARY, its collections are largest of any state university, third in American colleges, exceed three million items. Displays in the first floor corridors and the main reading room and circulation room on second floor interest visitors. This building also houses the Library School.
- 57 GREGORY HALL, named for the first head of the university, houses College of Education, School of Journalism and Communications, studios of Radio Station WILL, classrooms and offices.
- 58 AUDITORIUM, seats 1,963 persons.
- 59 LINCOLN HALL, named for Abraham Lincoln, who

- signed the Land Grant College Act under which this University was established. Headquarters of the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences. Museum of European and Asiatic Culture is on the fourth floor. The well-equipped Lincoln Hall theater seats 750.
- 60 BEVIER HALL, named for first full-time research worker in home economics; center for women's activities, and includes offices of the Dean of Women and department of home economics; playground of child development laboratory adjoins on the south.
- 61 ADMINISTRATION BUILDING, offices of the President, Provost, Graduate College, Comptroller, Dean of Students, Dean of Men, Physical Plant Department, Admissions and Records, Purchasing Agent, University Press, and Public Relations.
- 62 MATHEMATICS BUILDING.
- 63 ALTOELD HALL, named for an Illinois governor instrumental in the University's development, houses College of Law. A fine example of Romanesque architecture, interior details and the library are of interest. Carillon in tower is gift of alumni.
- 64 ILLINI UNION BUILDING, "front door" of the campus for visitors and "community center" for students and staff, includes lounges, reading rooms, dining rooms, cafeteria, bowling alleys, game room, ballroom, meeting rooms, ticket sales windows, information desk, offices of the Alumni Association and of student activities.
- 65 CIVIL ENGINEERING HALL, headquarters of College of Engineering and Engineering Experiment Station.
- 66 UNIVERSITY FIRE STATION.
- 67 ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING ANNEX.
- 68 ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING RESEARCH LABORATORY.
- 69 AERONAUTICAL LABORATORY B, includes a shock tube for supersonic research.
- 70 WOODSHOP AND FOUNDRY.
- 71 MEN'S OLD GYMNASIUM AND ANNEX.
- 72 TALBOT LABORATORY, named for an alumnus—a great engineer and pioneer in many fields of research. In the central large bay is a testing machine capable of exerting three million pounds force in either tension or compression. Other machines produce repeated stress tests. Portions of bridges and other structures are built and tested. Other laboratories in this building are used for railway rail, metal fatigue, plastics, hydraulics, lead cable, and many other kinds of research.
- 73 NORTH GREENHOUSE.
- 74 ELECTRICAL ENGINEERING BUILDING; the ground-level dynamo laboratory is an amazing sight; other laboratories are devoted to electrical, radio, and illumination teaching and research. In one room is the electric network analyzer which can reproduce the entire power network of the state.
- 75 VIVARIUM, for work in biological sciences.

- 76 INSTITUTE OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS.
  - 77 ARCADE BUILDING, includes among other units the Visual Aids Service providing educational films to schools of the state.
  - 78 ILLINI HALL, headquarters of the Division of University Extension, correspondence courses, student housing, student employment, and others; also of *The Daily Illini*, student newspaper.
  - 79 SPEECH CLINIC, a teaching, research, and service center available for adults and children from all over the state.
  - 80 DAVENPORT HOUSE, headquarters for the University's nonacademic personnel and the University Health Service.
  - 81 UNIVERSITY MAILING CENTER.
  - 82 BUREAU OF EDUCATIONAL RESEARCH, another University unit serving the whole state.
  - 83 SURVEYING BUILDING.
  - 84 SIXTH STREET BUILDING, used by dramatics and other classes.
  - 85 ARCHITECTURE BUILDING, headquarters of College of Fine and Applied Arts. Exhibition hall and corridors have outstanding displays.
  - 86 VETERINARY CLINIC.
  - 87 NATURAL RESOURCES BUILDING, headquarters of State Natural History and State Geological Surveys.
  - 88 BAND BUILDING.
  - 89 ARMORY, headquarters for Army, Navy, and Air Force Reserve Officers' Training Corps units. Also used for indoor track and for indoor baseball practice. Facilities include rifle ranges, theater, and shops.
  - 90 ICE SKATING RINK, a gift to the University.
  - 91 GEORGE HUFF GYM, named after a famous director of athletics, headquarters of the School of Physical Education. With temporary bleachers seats 7,000 for basketball games.
  - 92 MEN'S RESIDENCE HALLS, housing for 884 men.
  - 93 PARADE GROUND HOUSING UNITS, housing for 750 men.
  - 94 MEMORIAL STADIUM, a gift from alumni, students, and friends in memory of Illinois alumni dead in World War I, seats 71,000.
- Located west—right—of map area are:  
 STADIUM TERRACE, provides housing for 492 families.  
 PHYSICS RESEARCH LABORATORY, used for betatron research. On display is original 2½-million volt machine made in 1940. In use are 22-million, 80-million, and 340-million volt betatrons, the last producing cosmic ray energies.  
 ABBOTT POWER PLANT, provides electrical power and steam heat for the entire University through miles of tunnels and underground installations.  
 SMALL HOMES RESEARCH CENTER, carries on many projects for home improvement.
