

Captain Thomas J. Smith
Donor of the "Tina Weedon Smith Memorial
Building" for Music, the Corner
stone of which will be laid today at
the University of Illinois.

To Captain Thomas J. Smith, a lawyer of
Champaign, belongs the distinction of having made
the largest contribution of any private citizen to
the State University. In 1914 Captain Smith gave
\$215,000 in Illinois lands to the University of
Illinois for the purpose of erecting a memorial
building that should be dedicated to music and
that should be in memory and honor of his wife
who died in August 1903.

Part of the dream of Captain Smith is being
made real today in the laying of the corner stone
of the "Tina Weedon Smith Memorial Building" on
the campus of the University of Illinois. Appro-
priate exercises will be held at 4:00 P.M. in the
University Auditorium.
