



Relations, Small Homes Council, Student Counseling Bureau, and the Institute for Research on Exceptional Children.

Among special services are those of the University's Division of Services for Crippled Children in Springfield, the University hospitals and clinics in Chicago, radio station W I L L, television station W I L L-T V, and the University Press.

On the Urbana-Champaign campus there are nearly 100 buildings. The University has an Airport larger in extent than Chicago's Midway Airport, and forty aircraft for flight instruction and air transportation. Robert Allerton Park, near Monticello, Illinois, an endowed gift to the University, is open to the public, and its Allerton House is used as a University conference center. Agricultural fields and farms include more than 1,600 acres adjoining the Urbana-Champaign campus and areas in 31 other counties throughout the varying soil and climatic regions of the state.

At the professional colleges in Chicago the Medicine-Dentistry-Pharmacy Building has several museums, an autopsy amphitheater, an auditorium, and laboratories for individual and class work. The clinics and hospitals include the Research and Educational Hospitals, the Neuro-psychiatric Institute, and several other hospitals and research institutes operated jointly by the State and the University.

Administration of the University is in a Board of eleven Trustees, including the Governor and the State Superintendent of Public Instructions as *ex officio* members. The other nine are also elected directly by the people of Illinois.

Dr. David Dodds Henry is the twelfth President of the University of Illinois. His predecessors were: Dr. John Milton Gregory, Regent from 1867 to 1880; Dr. Selim Hobart Peabody, Regent from 1880 to 1891; Dr. Thomas Jonathan Burrill, Acting Regent from 1891 to 1894; Dr. Andrew Sloan Draper, President from 1894 to 1904; Dr. Edmund Janes James, President from 1904 to 1920; Dr. David Kinley, President from 1919 to 1930; Dr. Harry Woodburn Chase, President from 1930 to 1933; Dr. Arthur Hill Daniels, Acting President from 1933 to 1934; Dr. Arthur Cutts Willard, President from 1934 to 1946; Dr. George Dinsmore Stoddard, President from 1946 to 1953; and Dr. Lloyd Morey, President from 1953 to 1955.

THE UNIVERSITY OF ILLINOIS

The University of Illinois was incorporated by an act of the General Assembly of Illinois, approved February 28, 1867, and opened on March 2, 1868. It is one of the state universities which came into existence pursuant to an act of the United States Congress, commonly known as the "Morrill Land Grant College Act." This act, approved by President Abraham Lincoln on July 2, 1862, was the culmination of a movement developed as early as 1850 by Jonathan Baldwin Turner, a citizen of Jacksonville, Illinois.

The principal support of the University of Illinois is provided by the State of Illinois, through biennial appropriations made by the General Assembly. Tuition fees paid by students also provide a substantial source of income for the University's educational programs.

At Urbana-Champaign the Colleges are Agriculture, Commerce and Business Administration, Education, Engineering, Fine and Applied Arts, Graduate College, Law, Liberal Arts and Sciences, and Veterinary Medicine. The Schools are Journalism and Communications, Library, Music, Physical Education, and Social Work. Other divisions and separate departments at Urbana are University Extension, Division of Special Services for War Veterans, Summer Session, Air Force Science, Naval Science, and Military Science and Tactics.

The University's Colleges of Medicine, Dentistry, and Pharmacy and the School of Nursing are in Chicago's Medical Center District. The Chicago Undergraduate Division is at Navy Pier (in quarters leased from City of Chicago), and instruction is given in the first two years of college study in the liberal arts and sciences, commerce and business administration, architecture, and engineering.

The institutes, bureaus, and other units at Urbana-Champaign for research and service are Agricultural Experiment Station, Institute of Aviation, Bureau of Business Management, Institute of Communications Research, Bureau of Economic and Business Research, Bureau of Educational Research, Engineering Experiment Station, Extension Service in Agriculture and Home Economics, Institute of Government and Public Affairs, Bureau of Institutional Research, Institute of Labor and Industrial
